LORD, NOW LETTEST THOU (No. 1)

(ST. SIMEON'S PRAYER)

Aleksandr Dmitrievich Kastalsky (1856-1926) was the leader of a movement in late 19th-century Russia to develop a new style of Orthodox choral music, based on ancient chants and elements from Russian folk singing. The beauty and simplicity of his works enables them to speak to people of all generations and nationalities.

While many of Kastalsky's sacred works are based on pre-existing chant melodies, Lord, Now Lettest Thou (No. 1) is labelled demestrom, which, according to the terminology of the time, indicates that it is a free composition. (This use of the term demestrom must not be confused with the same term used in connection with a style of monophonic chant and early polyphony in 16th-17th-century Russia.)

The present English edition is based on the composer's version for small choir (there is also an alreangement for large choir with a baritone soloist), published in Russia during the composer's lifetime. All tempo and dynamic markings have been preserved from the original Slavonic edition.
