## FOR ONTHODOX LITURGE THE LORD'S PRAYER

The present version of the Lord's Prayer is in a simple style suitable for singing by the entire congregation, as is traditional in the Orthodox Church. The same Little Znamenny Chant melody (in Tone 6) can also be used for singing the Creed. The original Slavonic harmonization (for male chorus) appeared in the *Notnyi Sbornik Pravoslavnogo Russkogo Tserkovnogo Peniia*, Vol. I (London: 1962) pp. 249-50. In this edition the work has been transposed up by a fourth for mixed chorus. Dynamics and marks of expression have been preserved from the original. Additional responses after the Lord's Prayer have been added by the editors.
