THE GREAT LITANY

The Very Reverend James Camal Meena (b. 1924) has been associated with Orthodox liturgical singing from his childhood. The son of a priest, he served as a reader, singer, and choir director, prior to his ordination to the priesthood. He holds a music degree in theory and composition from Baldwin-Wallace College and is Past Director of Sacred Music for the Antiochian Orthodox Christian Archdiocese.





THE GREAT LITANY

Pavel Grigor'evich Chesnokov (1877-1944) was one of the most prominent choral musicians to come out of the Moscow Synodal Choir School. A prolific composer of church music, he produced over 300 titles, encompassing virtually every element of the liturgical year. Both his chant harmonizations (approximately one-third of his output) and his free compositions reveal a great sensitivity to choral sonority--an outgrowth of his outstanding abilities as a choral conductor.

The *Great Litany*, from the *Divine Liturgy*, Opus 42, is a free composition that utilizes motives drawn from other sections of the work. The present edition is based on the original Slavonic version published by P. Yurgenson during the composer's lifetime. Tempo and dynamic markings are the composer's.
