

HYMNS FOR THE ORTHODOX LITURGY

GLAD SOME LIGHT

Aleksandr Dmitrievich Kastalsky's close association with the Moscow Synodal Choir School resulted in his editing the standard harmonized *Obikhod* [Book of Common Hymns] used by the Synodal Choir. Among the several original harmonizations contributed to the book by Kastalsky is the present setting of *O Gladsome Light*, based on a variant of Kievan Chant.

In the English edition the work has been transposed and arranged in close harmony, making it suitable for small choirs. The composer's original tempo and dynamic markings have been retained; additional editorial markings are enclosed in brackets. The barring has been rearranged to correspond with the English text, and auxiliary time signatures have been supplied by the editor.
