HIMMS FOR OPTHODOX LITURGE

OPEN TO ME THE DOORS OF REPENTANCE

This setting of *Open to me the Doors of Repentance* is an example of the numerous anonymous chant harmonizations that became widespread in Russia after the introduction of part-singing in the second half of the seventeenth century. Although the melody is not to be found in the official chant-books published by the Holy Synod of the Russian Orthodox Church, it displays a number of features that identify it with Kievan Chant -- a clearly marked and regular meter, a predominantly syllabic text, and a narrow melodic compass that lends itself easily to harmonization by means of several basic triads.

The English edition is based on a Slavonic version for female or male chorus that appeared in a collection entitled *Tserkovnoe Penie: Krug bogosluzhebnykh pesnopenii* [Church singing: a cycle of liturgical hymns, published in 1905 by the St. Vladimir's Church-Teachers' Women's School in St. Petersburg. In the present edition the work has been transposed for mixed chorus. Dynamics and tempo markings have been added by the arranger.
